# Last revised 05/22/13 M-FUGE MINISTRY TRACKS

At M-Fuge, your students can make their ministry track selections prior to arrival at camp. Once you download your Participant List, you will find a place on this grid to record each student and adult's top three track selections. All students (completed 6th grade – college) must provide three different ministry track options. Adults can provide three ministry track options if specific preferences are desired. However, it is easier for M-Fuge to place adults in tracks with their own students if they simply indicate that they are "Flexible". Both students and adults will be placed in one of their top three track selections. Providing this information prior to your arrival at camp will allow M-Fuge to give more of your students their preferred choices. Their options are:

**Children's Ministry**: This ministry track involves working with children in a variety of settings including: Vacation Bible Schools, Backyard Bible Clubs, Day Camps, and other site-specific work with children. The purpose of this track is to minister to children, providing your students with the opportunity to teach and lead children through Bible stories, games, crafts, and music.

**Social Ministry**: This ministry track provides students a variety of ministry opportunities for meeting the physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual needs of people. Students in this track my minister in: mentally/ physically handicapped centers, homeless shelters, soup kitchens, food banks, clothing closets, furniture distribution centers, refugee ministries, prison ministries, Baptist Centers, Salvation Army Sites, and other community organizations with similar purposes. Students will work both directly with people in the community as well as behind the scenes.

**Painting, Construction, and Yard Work Ministry**: Students in this track will spend their time doing light construction work, roofing, repairing, cleaning, painting, and yard work. These tracks work with various organizations such as Habitat for Humanity and local housing authorities to meet the physical needs of churches, schools, families and individuals.

**Games and Recreation Ministry**: This ministry track is designed to help students use their athletic ability and willing hearts to share the gospel through sportsmanship and Christ-like attitudes. These tracks are located in children's centers or homes, apartment complexes, and boys and girls clubs.

**Homeless Ministry**: This track is designed to minister specifically to the homeless population. Students will spend each day visiting with the homeless in shelters, building relationships, serving meals, leading games with children, etc.

\*NOTE: Beginning in 2013, Creative Ministry will no longer be offered as a stand-alone track option. However, students and adults who come to camp will be encouraged to use their God-given creative abilities through other tracks including Children's, Games and Recreation, and Social.
